

# The 2002 California QSO Party

Wow! What a contest! This was a banner year for the "California Sweepstakes". I don't think activity has ever been higher or the competition stiffer than in the 2002 CQP.

This year, we received a total of 597 logs, which is a whopping 21% increase over last year. I only wish the stock market had been this good.

## SINGLE OP RESULTS - CA

This year we had a really tight race for top score between N6ED, K6LA and K6LL (at K6NA). Ken described this himself: "...as I listened to both Dave and Craig toward the end, I was pulling away from Dave, but Craig was pulling away from me, up around 60 QSOs. Traditionally, I get a lot more CW QSOs than Craig and about the same as Dave. This year I got 145 more CW QSOs than last year for a total of 889. I'm hoping I have more than 120 more CW QSOs than Craig to make up the difference in raw QSO numbers and come out on top. But whatever the result, contesting doesn't get more fun than this."

As you can see in the results, the scores are very close with N6ED getting 69 more QSOs than K6LA, who in turn had 95 more than K6LL. Considering these guys had about 2500 QSOs each that is a small margin indeed. K6LA did have more CW QSOs, but not enough to overcome Craig's lead.

S/O low power stations were considerably further behind the leaders. K6AM in San Diego led the LP group with a new low power record performance beating N6MU in Kern county and AA6PW in Orange county

As I sit here in San Jose writing this report, I'm a bit dismayed that all three top S/O and top three S/O low power stations were in southern California.

The top 20 S/O stations are also the CA wine winners. You can see those stations on the awards page, and what it takes to win the wine in CQP. It now takes a score of > 230k to win the wine .. up from 200k last year.

## SINGLE OP RESULTS - non CA

In the non-CA single op category, W8MJ dominated the competition and easily won not only the top non-CA S/O category, but also the low power category, and the 1<sup>st</sup> to 58 challenge. Ken set three new records in the process. N0AC and K9ZO fought a close battle for 2<sup>nd</sup> place, but were well behind Ken. Low power competition was offered by CJ7RR (VA7RR) and N4PN but they couldn't come close to W8MJ. The only record not broken by W8MJ was the all time non-CA high score still held by VA7RR.

Again, if you look at the non-CA wine list, you'll see the top 20 single ops and what it takes to win the wine from outside CA. Its getting tougher every year.

## MULTI-SINGLE -

M/S competition has a new force to contend with. W6YX. The Stanford Radio Club (S/O last year) put on a great show with 6 operators sharing the "chair". They were followed by W6PT and W6EEN in an incredibly close race for 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

## MULTI-MULTI -

The biggest score by any station any where was (again) the massive N6O effort put out by the Radio Oakley M/M folks. They operated five transmitters, and have set M/M records several years in a row. This year, one of their logging computers crashed big time and they lost all of their 160 and 20 meter logs. Despite this blow they still won with over 3,500 QSOs. It's sort of like competing with one arm behind your back.

Close behind were K6IDX and the county expedition of W6ML. Of special note was N6XI who was actually a M/S entry but disregarded the 10 minute rule. This handicap of M/S stations has been addressed and new rules will take effect next year.

## MOBILES -

Once again, all California Counties were on the air in force, thanks in large part to the Mobile operations by K6AQL (K0DI, K0KTZ) who covered 25 counties; from Alameda to Yuba. This is the same route they have used in the past, and this time they put a special effort into making more CW contacts. They were joined by WA6FGV (one county), K6PJ (9 counties), K6III (one county), and K6MI (three counties).

Several non-CA mobiles also joined the fun. Entries were received from K8MAT (OH), KC0HMJ (NE), KB3HWA (MD), N8ZR (OH), and K9KKX (IL).

## COUNTY EXPEDITIONS -

County Expeditions are Field Day style operations from rare counties, or at least a nice location that's off the

beaten path. Fourteen different County Expeditions were active in 13 different counties.

These operations ranged from simple to complex M/M. Doing an expedition can be a lot of fun. Top S/O Expedition score goes to W6PH in Inyo county followed by W6PZ (K6SRZ) in Trinity county. Top M/S Expedition score was W6PT in Imperial county, and the top M/M Expedition was, once again, W6ML in Mono county.

Of special note was the combined Expeditions of K6L (Lake) and K6C (Colusa). These two stations were located about 100 yards from each other and manned by the same operators.

## SWEEPS -

A big part of the fun is to work all 58 multipliers. Given the huge participation of CQP this year it was easier than ever to make the "sweep".

Even with all this activity, only 30 out of state stations managed to work a complete CA sweep. Compare that to only 9 last year! The toughest county appeared to be Yuba. One notable sweep was made by W4DKS who made all 58 counties in only 73 QSOs.

The very first sweep was made by W8MJ when he worked KJ6RA in Siskiyou county at 20:07Z. That's only 4 hours and 7 minutes into the contest. Congratulations!

In California, no less than 45 stations found all 50 US states plus the eight Canadian call districts for sweeps. Compare this to only 36 last year. This is the only state QSO party where the number of multipliers is the same for both in-state and out-of-state operators.

The very first sweep from CA was made by NT6K at 22:47Z or 6 hours and 47 minutes when he contacted VE4DIG. Congratulations!

## CLUBS -

CA Club competition is again a run away with the Mother Lode DX & Contest Club putting together another massive effort that resulted in 18 logs totaling over 2 million points. This is quite a reduction from last years' win with 26 logs and 2.6 million points, but never the less it is still the top club score. The next best club effort was by the Redwood Empire club with 10 logs and 848,466 points which is almost exactly the same score they achieved last year.

New for this year is the non-CA club competition. A new plaque sponsored by W6ZZZ is available from now on for non-CA clubs with the same rules as CA clubs. In this maiden year, the very first non-CA plaque goes to the Tennessee Contest Group. They managed 16 entries totaling 703,996 points! The next best club was Contest Club Ontario with 13 logs totaling 481,408 points.

#### QRP-

#### LOG CHECKING -

Our goal is to provide the best accuracy possible in these results. As always, there may be errors and any error found after publication will be updated on the CQP web site: <http://www.cqp.org>.

Logs without specifically showing an operating category were all entered as single op, high power. Many logs were received indicating an operating QTH very different than what others copied them to be on the air. In such cases, we used the vast majority of received reports rather than what was indicated in the log. Before submitting any log, please review it to be sure it has complete and accurate information.

Log checking was tackled by K6III, W6OAT, K6EP, N6DE, KF6RIP, N6ZFO and AD6E. Any simple copying error such as wrong NR, wrong QTH, or wrong call was penalized by reducing the score by 1/2 of that QSO. Double copying errors (e.g. wrong call and wrong NR) or worse were penalized by removing the QSO. The team used extensive search software to be as accurate as possible. Only QSOs that were either proven to be in error, or had a very highly probable error were reduced. No penalty was given by software alone. There was always a human judge to make the actual decision.

My thanks go to the log checkers who put in many hours of effort to get these results out. Their efforts have made these results more credible.
